<p>The subject of insurance law is devoted for the analysis of insurance contractual relations, activities performed by insurance companies and insurance intermediaries, and state supervision of these activities.</p> <p>Topics: the concept and development of insurance, content of the insurance contract, specific types of insurance contracts, licencing, management and control of the insurance undertaking, finance of insurance companies, reinsurance, general insurance, pension accumulation activities by insurance undertakings, activities of insurance intermediaries, reasons and objectives of state supervision of insurance and functions of the supervisory authority.</p> <p>The doctoral student, by finishing this study subject, should know various categories and rules of insurance law, the most relevant theoretical and practical problems in this field. The doctoral student must be acquainted with the most important sources of insurance law doctrine, legislation and case law. The doctoral student should be able to analyse the chosen insurance law problem in a broader context of legal and economic issues as well as be able to apply various legal research methods to assess and solve new theoretical and practical insurance law problems.</p>
