<p>International and European Union civil procedure unit is devoted for deepening knowledge of PhD students in the field of international civil litigation.</p> <p>Analyzed topics: concept of international civil procedure and its sources; procedural status of foreigners and persons without citizenship; international jurisdiction; peculiarities of international litigation and recognition and enforcement of foreign judgments and arbitral awards; Nature of EU civil procedure law, its relationship with national civil procedure; CJEU role in forming uniform legal practice; common jurisdiction rules for civil and commercial, family, insolvency cases in EU; recognition and enforcement of judgments in EU member states; EU legal regulation on service of judicial documents, gathering of evidence and summary proceedings; future tendencies and perspectives of EU civil procedure.</p> <p>After finishing the unit the doctoral students will master the system of international and EU civil procedure and have knowledge on how the same categories are perceived and interpreted in legal doctrine, legislative process and jurisprudence. After finishing the unit the doctoral students will be able to analyze the chosen problem in international and EU civil procedure in broader legal problems context, will be able to apply different legal research methods to analyse and solve theoretical and practical problems of international and European Union civil procedure.</p>
