<p>The subject of international and European Union labour law is designed to provide doctoral students with theoretical and practical knowledge of the regulation of labour relations not at the national level, but at the international and supranational level so that they correctly understand their meaning and are able to highlight, analyze and solve scientific problems. in the context of the system and in the light of European or international regulation.</p> <p>Topics analyzed: norms relevant to labour law issued by international organizations (United Nations, International Labor Organization and Council of Europe), mechanisms of their adoption, implementation and supervision; supranational organizations - the legal regulation of labour relations by the European Union, its historical development, essential characteristics, sources of law and peculiarities of their implementation in the Member States; basic rules issued on the movement of workers, equality, protection of workers' rights, collective redundancies, insolvency of the employer, transfer of a business or part of it, posting, atypical forms of employment (fixed-term contracts, part-time work, agency work) and many others areas (protection of young people, working time, safety and health of workers, information and consultation of workers in various commercial activities, etc.).</p> <p>Upon completion of the course, the doctoral student must have mastered the system of categories of International and EU labour law and have knowledge of how the same categories are perceived and interpreted in the doctrine of law, legislative process and jurisprudence. After completing the study, the doctoral student must be able to analyze the chosen problem of labour law in a broader context of theoretical problems of law, be able to apply various methods of legal research to assess and solve theoretical and practical problems of labour law.</p>
