This subject is devoted to the study of the mechanism of legal regulation of the interaction between society and the environment, the system of legal norms regulating the social relations of environmental protection and the use of natural resources, and the problems of its practical application.			
The following topics are analysed: the impact of sustainable development ideology on the development of environmental law, ensuring human rights related to the environment and its protection; problems of legal regulation and practical implementation of compensation for environmental damage at national and international level; environmental legal foundations of economic activity; legal aspects of protection of biodiversity; legal measures to prevent climate change; legal measures to ensure the rational use and protection of natural resources; problematic aspects of the legal regulation of waste management; etc.			
Upon completion of the subject, the doctoral student will have deepened his/her knowledge of the problematic issues of environmental law, will be able to carry out a scientific analysis and assessment of possible solutions to these problems, as well as the identification of the trends in the development of environmental law, and the identification of the directions of development.
