Subject annotation

The study subject *Problems of the history of legal thought* is intended to develop the doctoral students' abilities to independently analyze and evaluate the evolution of legal thought; based on the acquired knowledge, to reveal and substantiate such categories as law, justice, concepts of law, etc., as well as their genesis in an argumentative manner; to name the principles of law with an understanding of their formation history and being able to reveal their regulatory potential. The State cannot exist without law, and the law is created by the state power, so the evolution of legal thought is closely related to the development of the State, which means that studying this subject inevitably requires researching the patterns of formation and development of views about the State. Reflecting on the material of the *Problems of the history of legal thought* will serve not only to develop the legal intelligence and legal culture of the doctoral student, but will also be useful as a methodological basis for further scientific research.
