<p>The course is devoted to deepen knowledge for PhD students about one of the most important branches of law, which regulates solving of civil, labour, family, intellectual property, bankruptcy, restructuring and other disputes, arising out of private law relations, also non-contentious proceedings, enforcement procedure, recognition and enforcement of judgments of foreign countries in the Republic of Lithuania.</p> <p>Analyzed topics: concept of judicial civil procedure; civil procedure principles; participants to the civil proceedings, their types and legal status; court jurisdiction; civil cases proceedings; peculiarities of certain civil dispute handling type of Cases; fundamentals of enforcement procedure; problematic aspects of separate institutes of civil procedure.</p> <p>After finishing the unit doctoral student will master the system of categories of civil procedure law and have knowledge on how the same categories are perceived and interpreted in legal doctrine, legislative process and jurisprudence. After finishing the unit doctoral student will be able to discuss chosen problem of civil procedure law in broader context, will be able to apply different legal research methods to analyse and solve theoretical and practical problems of civil procedure law.</p>
