<p>This course is designated to deepen the knowledge of PhD students in legal regulation of property and other absolute rights to property and other movable property, first, for the analysis of Lithuanian positive law and case law. The most relevant problems are explored through comparative law, with a strong focus on the regulation of property law in international treaties and European Union legislation.</p> <p>Topics to be analysed during the course: the dilemma of formalism and functionalism, main principles of property law, the constitutionalisation of ownership law, the model of ownership (unitary/fragmented) and trust law, the modern approach to the security of obligations by rights <i>in rem</i>, system of protection of property rights and role of <i>quasi</i> property rights.</p> <p>Upon the completion of the course, the PhD student must have mastered the system of categories of property law and have knowledge of how the same categories are perceived and interpreted in legal doctrine, legislative process, and jurisprudence, to be able to analyse the chosen issue of property law in the broader context of theoretical problems of law, to know how to apply various methods of legal research which could assist to evaluate and to solve theoretical and practical problems of property law.</p>
