<p>The subject of public procurement law is intended to deepen doctoral students' knowledge of the sources of public procurement law in Lithuania, EU and other advanced countries, as well as Lithuanian and EU public procurement law itself, its concept and public procurement system.</p> <p>Topics analysed: principles of public procurement law of the Republic of Lithuania and the EU and participants in the public procurement process, norms regulating the start of public procurement, procurement documents, procurement methods, award criteria and procedure, end of public procurement and contract, protection of tenderers' rights and procedure of public procurement dispute resolution, case-law on Lithuanian and EU public procurement law, problematic issues of public procurement law. Socially sustainable, green procurement and national security considerations are also extensively analysed.</p> <p>Upon completion of the subject, the doctoral student must have mastered the system of categories of public procurement law and have knowledge of how the same categories are perceived and interpreted in legal doctrine, legislative process and jurisprudence. After completing the subject, the doctoral student must be able to analyse chosen problem of public procurement law in a broader context of theoretical problems of law and be able to apply various methods of legal research to evaluate and solve theoretical and practical problems of public procurement law.</p>
